

## State to tour contaminated land

Officials from Raytheon Company and the Massachusetts Environmental Policy Act Office plan next week to walk through a site on Boston Post Road formerly owned by the company, a Raytheon spokesman said. The walk-through, scheduled for 2:30 p.m. Wednesday at 420-440 Boston Post Road, is related to an application Raytheon made to the state to clean up contamination there, Amy Hosmer, a Raytheon spokesman, said in an interview yesterday. The company proposes to remove hazardous materials from soil and ground water on the 83-acre site, by excavating contamination in and around wetlands. The planned excavation would include an area of about 74,740 square feet, according to a written statement from the company. Comments on the Raytheon application may be sent to Secretary Ellen Roy Herzfelder, Executive Office of Environmental Affairs, Attention: Massachusetts Environmental Policy Act Office, Nicholas Zavolas, Senior Analyst, EOE No. 12984, 251 Causeway St., Suite 900, Boston, MA 02114. Comments are due by March 28, according to the state environmental agency's website. Hosmer said the company plans to hold a public meeting about the cleanup in April.
