

MEPA site visit to be at Raytheon

WAYLAND – Raytheon is proposing to remedy contaminated wetland soil/sediment at the former 83-acre Raytheon Facility in Wayland. This project will involve the excavation of approximately 1.5 acres of contaminated soil/sediment within bordering vegetated wetland areas.

The Massachusetts Office of Environmental Affairs has requested a walkover of the site for members of the Massachusetts regulatory departments. The site visit is part of the on-going Massachusetts Environmental Protection Act (MEPA) permit application review process. The MEPA site visit is scheduled for Wednesday, March 12, at 2:30 p.m., at the former Raytheon facility on Rte. 20, 440 Boston Post Road.
