

## Updates on ongoing Wayland issues

**Dow case study published:** The John Snow Institute (JSI), Boston, recently published "From Confrontation to Collaboration" detailing lessons learned during the cleanup of hazardous waste at the former Dow Chemical Research Facility, Route 30, Wayland. The study was written independently by Licensed Site Professionals (LSPs) Dr. Irwin Silverstein and Anne Marie Desmarais and chronicles stakeholders' perspectives after achieving an environmental cleanup that exceeded DEP's strictest standards.
